Here you can:

- Just Declare (no bidding)
- Bridge Master - lets you play the hand and then gives you the solution if you need it. It is an excellent tool to improve your declarer play

- Play with friends online ([instructions](#)). A quick video about how you and three of your friends can get together and play on Bridge Base Online (BBO)
- Games, tournaments and solitaire
- Just Play Bridge (play with robots – not recommended for Beginners)

## **3 Online Play**

Both [Tricky Bridge](#) and [Classic Bridge / Coppercod](#) allow you to play hands and tournaments online. Recommended for beginners.

- [Bridge Today](#) (on BBO) and [NSBC Online Bridge](#) (on RealBridge) have regular sessions where you play against other players at a cost. A reasonable amount of experience is needed to play in these sessions.
